## What is the Rhyl Community Network?

An informal approach to linking local groups together, those who want to share knowledge experience, skills and opportunities to address shared challenges in making Rhyl a better place to live through collaboration and supporting each other.

#### What is the background?

The Network is part of a programme called CADP (Community Anchor Development Programme) which provides flexible funding to a small number of groups across Wales to help the become stronger and be better placed to face future challenges.

We believe that the greatest strength in Rhyl are the many diverse and unique groups helping local people, and as such will be using the funding to try and capitalise on that strength and grasp new opportunities through collaboration.

# How do I get involved?

Your groups can get involved in many ways, through this networking page on Facebook, attending Network meetings or having our Network Coordinator come and visit you, we want involvement it be as simple as possible and on your terms.

#### How can my group benefit from the Network?

We are attempting to provide a wide range of opportunities based on what groups have told us are challenges they face, to date we have:

A Community Fleet (shared use of low-cost community vehicles)

A Community Asset Bank (shared access to events equipment)

A Community Training package (shared access to various courses)

A Community Network coordinator (a person to share information and support local groups on their terms)

We would then look at how to allocate funding or seek additional funding to make things happen.
